Course Description:

The summer is a great time to find your own sea glass, enjoy the subtle colours and create jewellery that is perfect for a summery look. Discover the properties of sea glass and the techniques involved in drilling, wrapping and setting it to make silver and sea glass jewellery. By the end of the workshop you will have created at least one piece of sea glass and silver jewellery using a range of tools and jewellery making processes.

If you don't have sea glass of your own, we will have pieces you can use on the day.

Amanda Hunter is a jeweller and educator who loves to teach people how to make jewellery. She has been running her own jewellery business, Passion Flower Studio, for nine years and specialises in making individual pieces in silver and gold. A key feature of her work is surface texture created using natural and found objects. What she loves most about making jewellery is that it isn't a delicate process. It involves bashing, bending, heat, acid, concentration and burnishing to turn an uninspiring piece of metal into a beautiful piece of jewellery to wear.
